I just wanted to let you know that I have registered for the OCF Tibet/Nepal cycle challenge from April 22<sup>nd</sup> to May 17th.

OCF (The Oncology Children's Foundation) is a not-for-profit Children's Charity exclusively devoted to raising funds for medical research into finding a cure for childhood cancer.

I want to do this ride both as a personal challenge as well as a means by which I can raise funds for OCF in support of their determination to save the lives of children with cancer.

Participation will inevitably lead to a degree of pain and discomfort. But one thing is for sure. There will be relief when I cross the finish line.

I can only try to imagine the situation of a child with cancer or leukaemia, the pain that they have to endure and the pressure placed on friends and family. For many the pain never comes to an end. Over 700 Australian children under the age of 16 are diagnosed with cancer every year. Tragically, their mortality rate is one in four.
